The College of Engineering, Architecture and Technology recently named Camden McDonald, Piper Swain and Austin Wallick as 2025 W.W. Allen Scholars.



## OSU research explores collaborative biofabrication for personalized health care

### Dr. Kara's lab awarded \$70K in **IBM Quantum credits to advance** fluid dynamics

Led by Dr. Kursat Kara, assistant professor in the School of Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering, the KARA Lab is exploring how emerging quantum computing technologies can enhance simulations of fluid behavior around textured surfaces. The research will explore how quantum computers, which process information in entirely new ways, might help simulate these flows faster and more accurately.
