CEAT Summer Bridge Counselor

Summer 2020 (see dates below)

The CEAT Summer Bridge Program (CSBP) is a 3-week (July 19th – August 7th) residential program for incoming CEAT freshmen. The objective of CSBP is to ease the transition for incoming freshmen to OSU. The program will emphasize academics, leadership, and professional development along with communitybuilding. Counselors will serve as mentors and will facilitate many of the Summer Bridge activities. Selected counselors will receive a stipend as well as room and board.

Eligibility/Expectations:

- Must be a returning CEAT student with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.
- Required to attend/monitor the weekday study halls and weekday activities.
- Expected to present student success strategies at the weekday study halls.
- Must live in Parker Hall with the participants for the first two weeks of the program.
- Expected to exhibit professional behavior to all participants, counselors, and program staff.
- Expected to attend a training session at future date to be determined.

CEAT Parker Hall "PEATE" Mentor Academic Year 2020-2021

CEAT Parker Hall is a Living Learning Program during the 2020-2021 academic year for incoming CEAT freshmen designed to facilitate student engagement and promote academic success. Mentors assist in cultivating a community atmosphere, building relationships, and providing guidance for the resident freshmen in Parker Hall. Mentors are known as Parker Engineering, Architecture, and Technology Experts (PEATEs) and live in Parker Hall with the CEAT freshmen. Selected PEATEs will receive a housing scholarship as well as a discounted housing rate.

Eligibility/Expectations:

- Must be a returning CEAT student with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.
- Must live in Parker Hall for the 2020-2021 Academic Year.
- Expected to provide ongoing support to Parker freshmen through genuine and strategic interactions.
- Must work closely with CEAT In-Residence (IR) staff and actively market/participate in monthly programming and social events in Parker Hall.
- Must attend training sessions.
- Expected to attend bi-weekly PEATE meetings during the fall and spring semesters.
- Will maintain strong, two-way communication with professional staff throughout the academic year.

CEAT Peer Mentor

Academic Year 2020-2021

CEAT Peer Mentors meet with assigned mentees twice per month during the 2020-2021 academic year to foster skills important in achieving academic success. One of the most essential skills encouraged is the utilization of resources. Peer Mentors also help students learn useful study techniques and problem solving strategies. Mentors encourage mentees to be engaged and utilize their time as CEAT students to maximize professional opportunities after graduation.

Eligibility/Expectations:

- Must be a returning CEAT student with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.
- Must have a sincere interest in contributing to the academic, social, and personal well-being of first-year students.
- Must meet twice with assigned mentees each month and attend monthly mentor training meetings.
- Actively communicates with mentees and encourages engagement in campus events and activities.
- Will maintain strong, two-way communication with professional staff throughout the academic year.
